The Fall Art Classes reached completion just before Thanksgiving. Classes included 6 week sessions in Watercolor taught by Rosalie

McCarthy, Basic Drawing taught by Donna Rockwell and Pastel Landscape by Ed Chesnovitch. Several workshops were also offered.

Palette Knife Painting with Mary Moquin and Teen Blockprinting with Hannah Bouvier. The next session of art classes is scheduled to begin the week of Feb. 22 and several new courses will be added to the offerings. Classes should be listed on our website by the first of the year.

Also in upcoming events we are holding a **Fine Art and Craft Holiday Boutique** at the Fessenden House (part of the Daniel Webster) this coming Sunday from 12 to 4:30. Hannah Bouvier is offering a once a month **Teen Block printing** session from 12:45 to 3:45 at the Sandwich Public Library Room #2. Each session is different and you need not be present for all. This session will cover Collagraph which is a simple and fun method of printmaking that involves adhering materials to a plate or board to build up a surface. Then it is rolled with ink and printed. It's creative, organic, meditative, and lots of fun. Students will have an opportunity to explore the materials and come up with unique individual prints.
